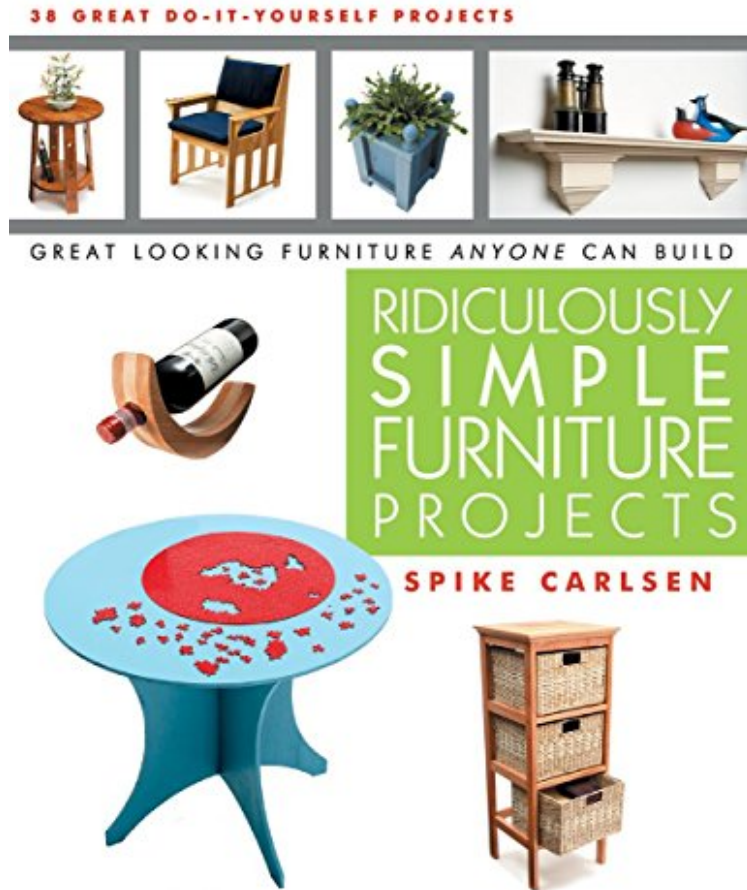

Projects that take less than an hour to more complex are in here. Even projects you can do from scraps you may have laying around. There are projects that anybody can do and with very minimal tools. If you ever went to a store and looked at a shelf and said wow that's crazy how much money these cost, do yourself a favor and pick up this book or one like it. You will see how simple it is to build some of this stuff. Even if you don't have any tools you can pick up a few cheap tools to get you started. Check pawn shops for tools if you are really on a budget. For under \$100 you can set yourself up with a few tools and materials for a couple of projects, plus once you have the tools you only need to buy them once (until you wear it out anyways which normally will take a long time if you take care of them).
