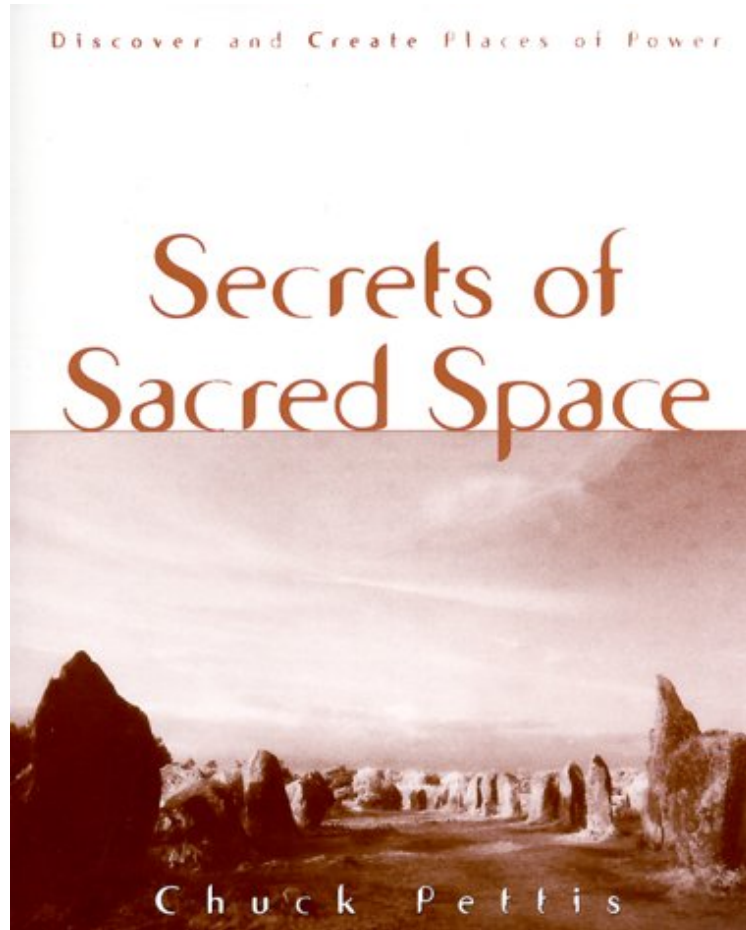

It is written in a friendly and accessible style with many rich anecdotes by a man who has committed many years to not only the study of sacred place, but to practical construction of new monuments. Surprisingly, it is not an exhaustive documentation or analysis of ancient sites, though there is some brief discussion of these. It is, first and foremost, a practical guide for those who wish to investigate the subtle aspects of place and to create sacred places today. For example, each chapter ends with a concise summary of the information covered in the chapter and a list of suggested exercises. The appendices include tables of the angles for significant solar and lunar events for several latitudes. The most remarkable thing about this book is the seamless blend of the mystical with the mathematical. Chuck Pettis is a mathematician, but is also a well known dowser and ley line hunter. Expect to have earth angels and subtle energies explained in one breath, and the mathematics of planetary motion and symbolic

This is the first book I ever read about sacred sites, in 2005. The pictures compelled me and the subject interested me, so I went on to explore the subject in more depth, primarily the reasons for their existence, visiting large sites in France and Britain. Then I felt the urge to build a stone circle or something similar myself. That is when I returned to this book. There are a plethora of books on the market since the publication of this one dealing with sacred sites, and many are wonderful. Each gives a different viewpoint and assessment which combine to present a full rich meaning to the existence and power of sacred sites. But I have to say, this one has proven unique. If you are wanting to build your own, incorporate one into your landscape, this is the first book you should have. I don't say that lightly, as I have a library of books on the subject. But none do what this author has done. It has been his life-long passion and he is one of the few to take the mathematics of stone circle construction, add it to the metaphysical *raison d'être* of their existence and created actual physical stone circles, possibly the first new constructions in America. Talk about putting your money where your mouth is! No other author of this subject has done that. So that makes him and this book unique and invaluable. I visited the stone circle he created in Earth Sanctuary on Whidbey Island, WA, curious as to whether dowsing and using formulae can actually produce a sacred circle, and I must say, the stone circle did indeed hold power. It was strong enough the top of my head felt it was going to lift off. So there was a distinct activation of the crown chakra with this circle, coupled with a consciousness-raising aspect, I'm sure. I was curious to know what this spot felt like before the stone circle was built, whether the circle amplified the native energy present, or actually shifted it as well. The author understands his subject well, is balanced in his presentation, and has proven he is sensitive to site and concept.
