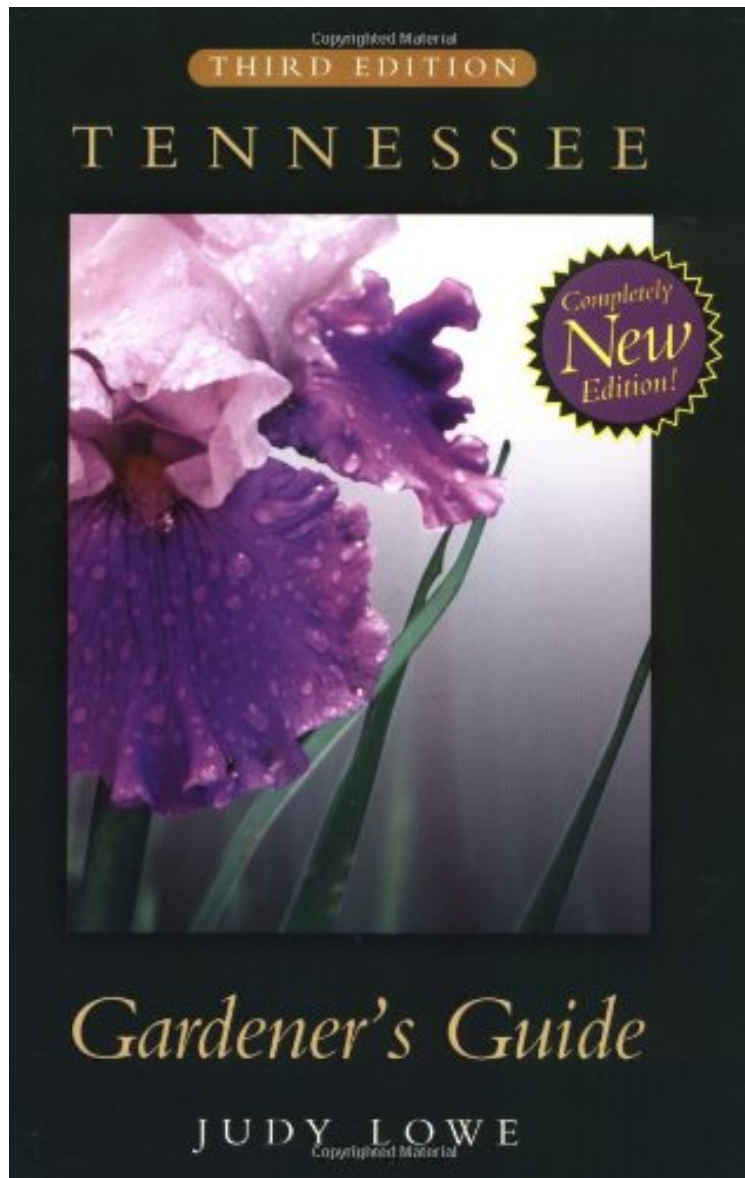

However, when I purchased the kindle edition, all the pictures are in greyscale (I have a color kindle fire and an iPad). To me, half the value of this book is the color photos. My recommendation is to skip the kindle version in favor of the paperback.
