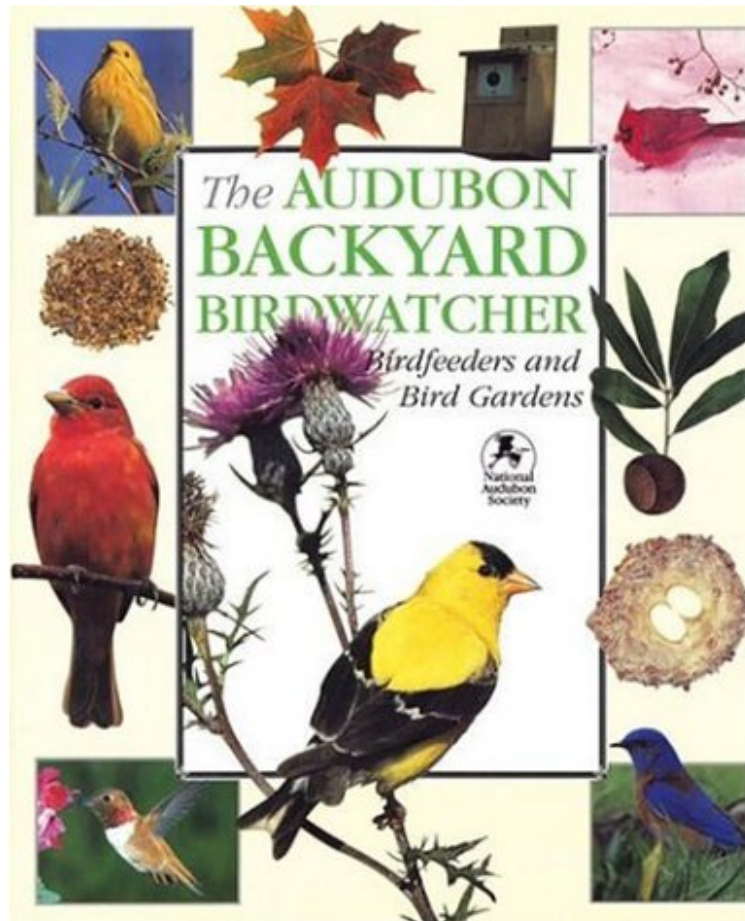

The Sibley guide covers more birds, but the Audubon has all of the common ones that I see in my yard, and has actual photos of the book as opposed to the drawings in the Sibley guide. I find that I refer to both of them frequently, however the Audubon book is one that you can sit down and read, whereas the Sibley one is a true field guide with just a paragraph on each type of bird. The Audobon book is a great starter book, and not only contains information on particular bird species, but also has great information on bird behavior and things you can do to encourage more visitors to your yard. I

It's very interesting and well-written, and contains all the basic information that's missing from the bird identification guides, like how birds build their nests and what the different calls and songs mean. There is also information on bird houses, attracting birds, water sources, gardens, and much more. Information on the most common birds and bird-helpful plants for the various regions of the United States is included too.
