I got tired of hearing about how fantastic she is and how great her gardening abilities are. I also don't laugh at people who buy produce in a grocery store, nor do I look down on non-gardeners, and I didn't care for her expressions of those feelings. A lot of her advice doesn't apply in central MN (where I am), so I found it less helpful. Her "science" is in several cases incomplete and out of date (I'm willing to bet that many people know and understand why some plants affect others positively and some negatively, as opposed to the "nobody" as she states in her book; I do). Her addiction to bleaching everything, or throwing away plastic containers if food spoils in them leads me to distrust some of her advice on sanitation, as I think she may overreact in some cases (but not necessarily all, as sanitation in canning is indeed very important). I'd also like to know what's wrong with her refrigerator if produce only lasts 2-3 days in it. Overall, if you choose this book, take everything with a grain of salt. Otherwise, keep looking. She gives very general overviews of concepts. If you're wanting actual techniques and trusted advice on how to do things, you might be better served by picking up other volumes on your

specific topics of interest (caning, drying, etc).0 of 1 people found the following review helpful. Based on the title, I was hoping for something very detailed and meaty that covered specific gardening techniques. While I was really disappointed, I think I was probably not the "target audience". If you are an inexperienced gardener, this would be a really good book, since it includes resources for where to find seeds and information, as well as overviews of types of gardening and other gardening topics. I was looking for more specific advanced information on vegetable gardening and more examples of how to grow and store the best veges.
